6. Description of the contract

The scope of works is the erection and commissioning the Emergency Care Unit as a separate building, a functional element of the Institute of Emergency Medicine facilities.

Legal status of the site – public property managed by Institute of Emergency Medicine.

Flat relief with no risk area (landslides, floods). The site has access from Toma Ciorba street. During the construction period the Contractor has to maintain accessibility of ambulances to the Institute of Emergency Medicine facilities.

The Contractor has to evacuate and dispose existing on-site utilities (pipes) and materials remaining after the demolation of the existing construction.

New facility data:

- Total built area is 1488 m²
- Total area of the building 3077 m²
- Usable area of the building 2939 m²
- Volume of the building 9200 m³.

Maximum available budget: 2.400.000 EUR

Only one lot

TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

8. Eligibility and rules of origin

Participation is open to all natural persons who are nationals of and legal persons (participating either individually or in a grouping – consortium - of tenderers) which are effectively established in a Member State of the European Union or in a eligible country or territory as defined under the Regulation (EU) N°236/2014 establishing common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for external action (CIR) for the applicable Instrument under which the contract is financed (see also heading 22 below). Participation is also open to international organisations. All supplies under this contract must originate in one or more of these countries. However, they may originate from any country when the amount of the supplies to be purchased is below100, 000 euros per purchased.

9. Grounds for exclusion

Tenderers must submit a signed declaration, included in the Tender Form for a Works Contract, to the effect that they are not in any of the situations listed in point 2.3.3 of the **Practical Guide.**

10. Number of tenders

Tenderers may submit only one tender per lot. Tenders for parts of a lot will not be considered. Any tenderer may state in its tender that it would offer a discount in the event that its tender is accepted for more than one lot. Tenderers may not submit a tender for a variant solution in addition to their tender for the works required in the tender dossier.

11. Tender guarantee

Tenderers must provide a tender guarantee of 1% of the budget available for the contract, when submitting their tender. This guarantee will be released to unsuccessful tenderers once the tender procedure has been completed and to the successful tenderer[s] upon signature of the contract by all parties.

12. Performance guarantee

The successful tenderer will be asked to provide a performance guarantee of 5% of the amount of the contract at the signing of the contract. This guarantee must be provided together with the return of the countersigned contract no later than 30 days after the tenderer receives the contract signed by the Contracting Authority. If the selected tenderer fails to provide such a guarantee within this period, the contract will be void and a new contract may be drawn up and sent to the tenderer which has submitted the next cheapest compliant tender.

14. Tender validity
